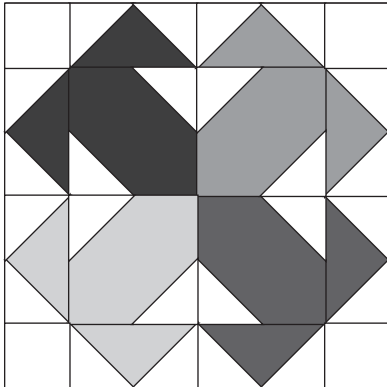

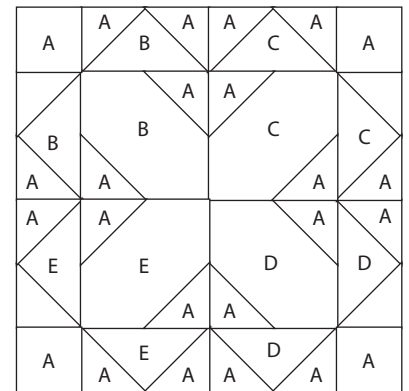

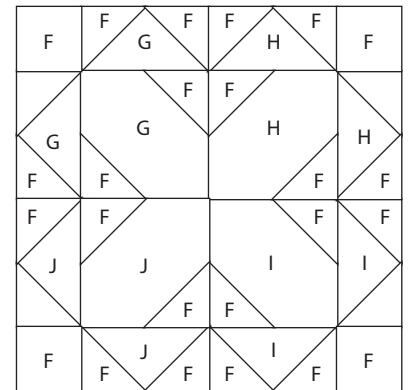

Cutting Instructions

Qty	9" finished block 13A	9" finished block 13B
28	2" squares (A)	2" squares (F)
1	3½" square (B)	3½" square (G)
2	3½" x 2" rectangles (B)	3½" x 2" rectangles (G)
1	3½" square (C)	3½" square (H)
2	3½" x 2" rectangles (C)	3½" x 2" rectangles (H)
1	3½" square (D)	3½" square (I)
2	3½" x 2" rectangles (D)	3½" x 2" rectangles (I)
1	3½" square (E)	3½" square (J)
2	3½" x 2" rectangles (E)	3½" x 2" rectangles (J)

 Depending on your planned layout, Fabric A and F may be the same 'Background' fabric.



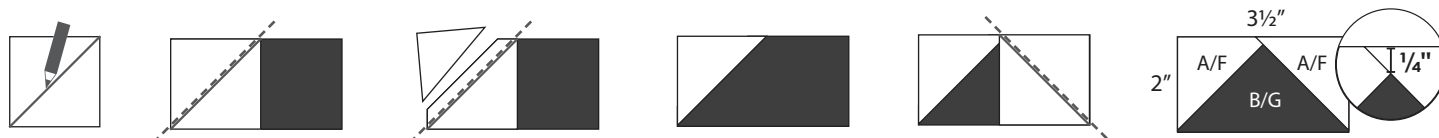


Piecing Instructions

Step 1

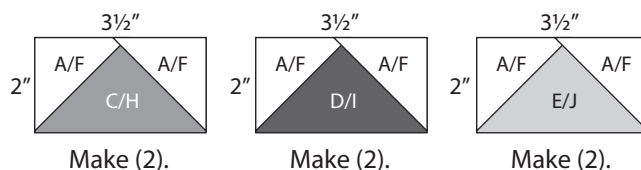
On the wrong side of (2) A/F squares, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.

Align an A/F square on one end of a B/G rectangle, right sides together as shown. Stitch on the drawn line, or just a thread's width outside of it, and trim the seam to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press the seam to the A/F triangle or open.



(1) B/G rectangle + (2) A/F squares
= 1 A/F-B/G flying geese

Make (2).



Align the other A/F square on the other end of the B/G rectangle, right sides together as shown. Stitch on the drawn line, or just a thread's width to the outside of it, and trim the seam to $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press seam to the A/F triangle or open.

Repeat to make (2) A/F-B/G, (2) A/F-C/H, (2) A/F-D/I, and (2) A/F-E/J flying geese. Trim units to $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2".

Step 2

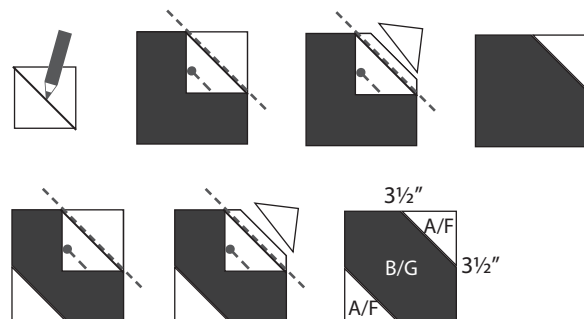
On the wrong side of (2) A/F squares, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.

Place an A/F square in the top left corner of a B/G square, right sides together as shown. Stitch on the line, or just a thread's width outside the line. Trim seam to $\frac{1}{4}$ ", and press seam to the A/F triangle or open.

Repeat on the opposite corner of the B/G square with the other A/F square.

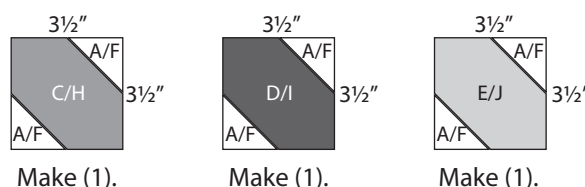
Repeat to make (1) A/F-C/H, (1) A/F-D/I, and (1) A/F-E/J diagonal units as shown.

Trim all units to $3\frac{1}{2}$ ".



(1) B/G square + (2) A/F squares =
1 A/F-B/G diagonal

Make (1).





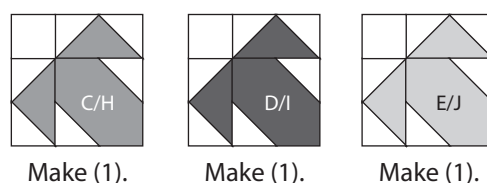
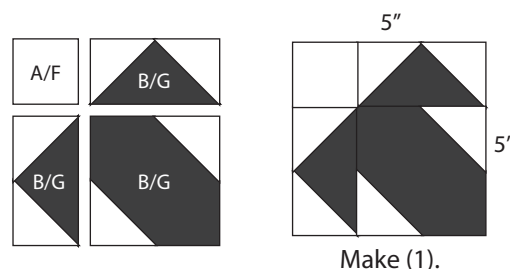
Piecing Instructions, continued

Step 3

Lay out (2) A/F-B/G flying geese, (1) A/F-B/G diagonal unit, and (1) A/F square as shown. Join units to form B/G T-square.

Trim unit to 5".

Repeat to make C/H, D/I, and E/J T-square units.

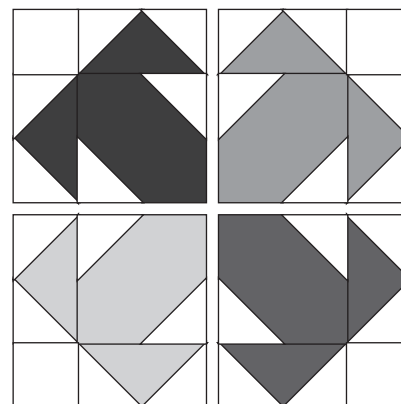


Step 4

Lay out (4) T-square units as shown.

Join units to make the full block.

Trim both blocks to 9½".
