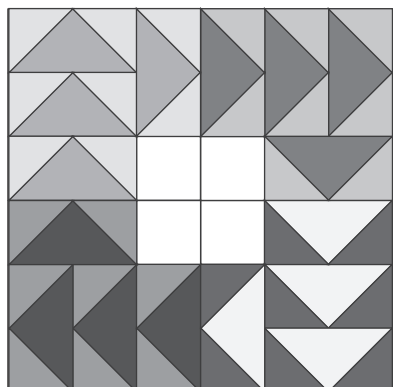

The Cloud Nine Block combines flying geese and a 4 patch to create a floating, serene design. The gentle movement of the shapes and the layered structure evoke a dreamy, carefree feeling, like drifting on a cloud.

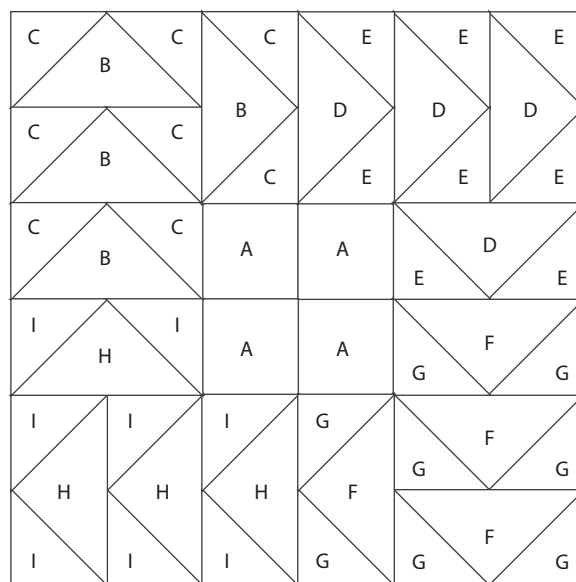

Cutting Instructions

Qty	9" finished block
4	2" squares (A)
1	4½" square (B)
4	2⅝" squares (C)
1	4½" square (D)
4	2⅝" squares (E)
1	4½" square (F)
4	2⅝" squares (G)
1	4½" square (H)
4	2⅝" squares (I)



Use this block to plan color and fabric placement!

Piecing Instructions

Step 1

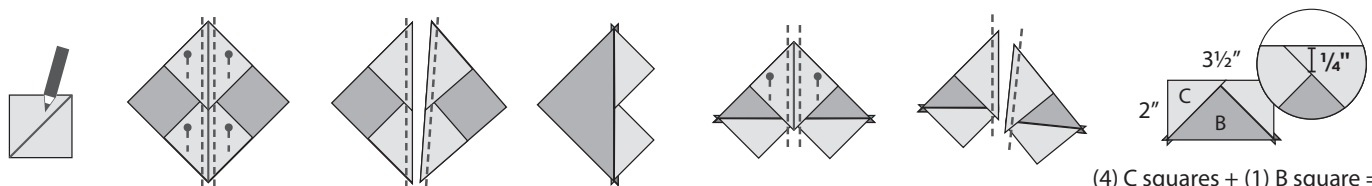
On the wrong side of all C, E, G, and I squares, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.

With right sides together, align (2) C squares in opposite corners of the B square as shown.

Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the square apart on the line to yield (2) partial flying geese units, and press the seams to the C triangles or open.

With right sides together, align another C square in the corner of the B triangle as shown.

Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the square apart on the line to yield (2) complete flying geese units, and press the seams to the C triangles or open.

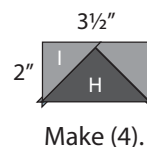
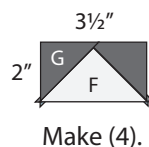
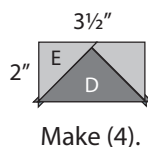


(4) C squares + (1) B square =
 (4) B-C flying geese

Make (4).

Repeat to make (4) B-C, (4) D-E, (4) F-G,
 and (4) H-I flying geese units.

Trim to $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2".



Step 2

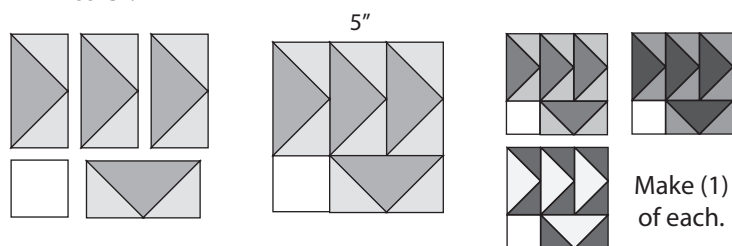
Lay out B-C flying geese and an A square as shown.

Join into two rows, pressing seams open.

Join rows to make the B-C flying geese unit.

Repeat to make D-E, F-G, and H-I flying geese units.

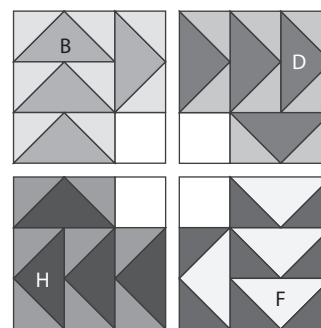
Trim to 5".



Step 3

Lay out flying geese units as shown.

Join to form the full block. Trim to $9\frac{1}{2}$ ".
