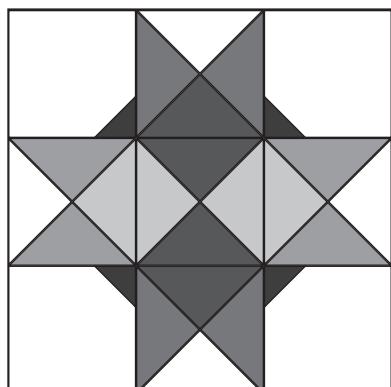

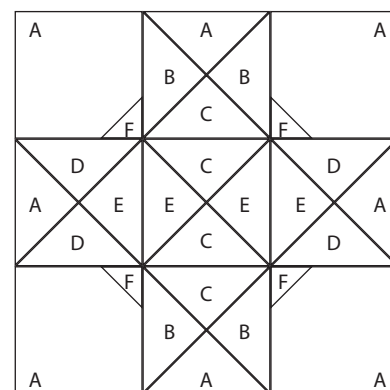

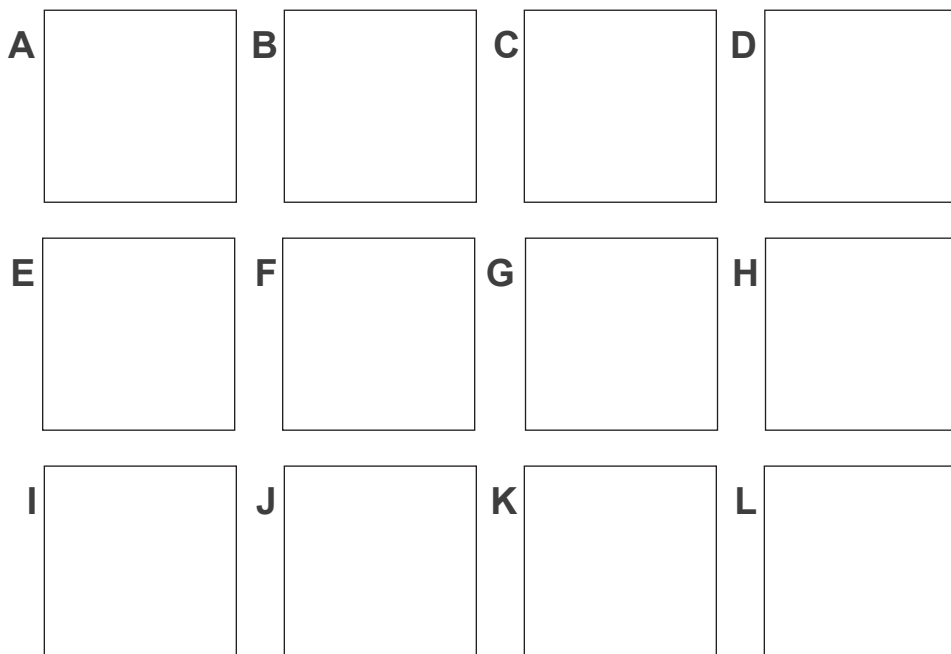

## Cutting Instructions

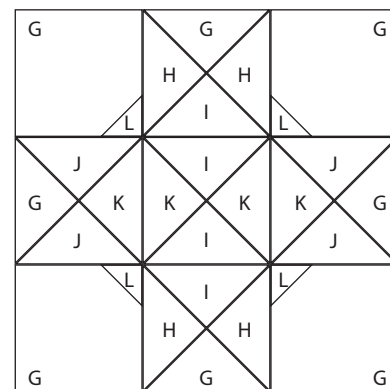
Qty	9" finished block 8A	9" finished block 8B
1	4½" square, cut in quarters diagonally (A)	4½" square, cut in quarters diagonally (G)
4	3½" squares (A)	3½" squares (G)
1	4½" square, cut in quarters diagonally (B)	4½" square, cut in quarters diagonally (H)
1	4½" square, cut in quarters diagonally (C)	4½" square, cut in quarters diagonally (I)
1	4½" square, cut in quarters diagonally (D)	4½" square, cut in quarters diagonally (J)
1	4½" square, cut in quarters diagonally (E)	4½" square, cut in quarters diagonally (K)
4	1½" squares (F)	1½" squares (L)

 Depending on your planned layout, Fabric A and G may be the same 'Background' fabric.



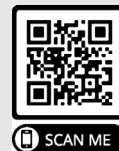

## Piecing Instructions

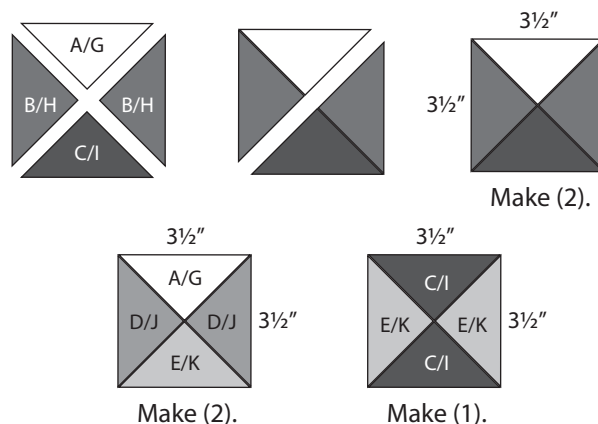
### Step 1

Lay out (1) A/G, (2) B/H, and (1) C/I quarter triangles as shown.

Join triangles into pairs, pressing seams to B/H triangles.

Join pairs to form Quarter-Square Triangle unit. Trim to  $3\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat to make (2) A/G-B/H-C/I QSTs.

Use the same process to make (2) A/G-D/J-E/K and (1) C/I-E/K QSTs.

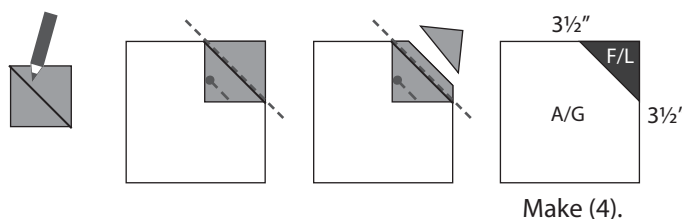


### Step 2

On the wrong side of each F/L square, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.

Place an F/L square in one corner of an A/G square, right sides together, as shown. Stitch on the line, or just a thread's width to the outside of the line. Trim seam to  $\frac{1}{4}$ ", and press seam to the F/L triangle.

Repeat to make (4) A/G-F/L flip corner units.

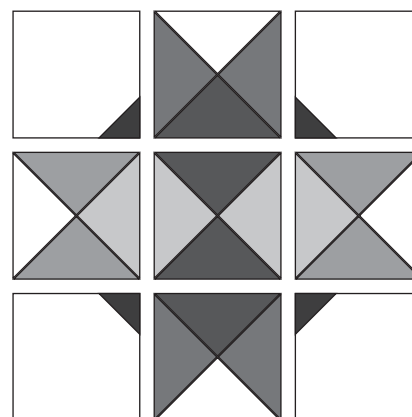


### Step 3

Lay out QSTs and flip corner units as shown.

Join units to make the full block.

Trim both blocks to  $9\frac{1}{2}$ ".

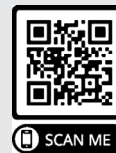
