

## **INGREDIENTS**

FROM FABRIC A, CUT:

- \* (4) 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" rectangles
- \* (4) 2½" squares

FROM FABRIC B, CUT:

\* (8) 2½" squares

#### FROM FABRIC C, CUT:

- \* (4) 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" squares
- \* (4) 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" rectangles

# **FROM FABRIC D, CUT:** \* (4) 1½" x 4½" rectangles

**FROM FABRIC E, CUT:** \* (4) 1½" x 4½" rectangles

**FROM FABRIC F, CUT:** \* (1) 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" square

**YIELD** 12" finished block

COORDINATING BELLA SOLIDS: 9900 200 (white) 9900 397 (light blue) 9900 123 (red) 9900 395 (dark blue)

# SUMMER IN THE COUNTRY: MILLENNIUM

### STEP 1. MAKE FLYING GEESE


Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all Fabric B squares. Line 1 square up with the corner of Fabric A rectangle. Sew on the marked line. Trim ¼" away from stitch line and press the point open. Repeat for the other side.


The geese should finish at  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ". Make 4.

## **STEP 2. MAKE MIDDLE UNITS**

Sew together D and E rectangles. Make 4.


Join each with 1 flying geese unit.





### **STEP 3. MAKE CORNER UNITS**

Sew together Fabric A and Fabric C squares. Add Fabric C rectangle. Make 4.



# ASSEMBLE THE BLOCK

Join block units as shown. Trim block to  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished size.
