WHAT YOU'LL NEED


For fabric choices refer to the block diagram

A: 72 squares (42 dark, 30 light) 2 1/8" x 2 1/8"


B: 4 squares 4 %" x 4 %", split diagonally


C: 13 squares 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"

D: 1 square 5 1/4" x 5 1/4", split twice diagonally to make 4 triangles








3. Arrange D triangles, B triangles and C squares into seven rows as shown. Sew pieces into rows and press. Join the rows and press to make the center unit measuring 17 ½" square.

4. Sew large triangle onto all four edges on the center unit to complete block. Block measures 24 ½" x 24 ½".




7. Referring to BASIC INSTRUCTIONS half-square-triangles layer a light and a dark A square. Make a total of 60 half-square-triangle-units. Trim the units to 2 ½" square. Split remaining 12 squares diagonally in halves.



2. Arrange half-square-triangles and A triangles in six rows as shown. Sew together rows and join rows to make a large triangle unit. Make four.
