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## Cutting Instructions

| Qty | 6" finished block | 12" finished block |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| 4 | 2" squares (A) | $311 / 2$ squares (A) |
| 4 | 3 " squares (B) | $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares ( $B$ ) |
| 4 | 3" squares (C) | $4112{ }^{1 / 2}$ squares (C) |
| 1 | $25 / 8$ " square (D) | $43 / 4$ " square (D) |
| 2 | $21 / 2 \prime$ " squares, cut in half diagonally (E) | 4" squares, cut in half diagonally (E) |

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## Piecing Instructions

## Step 1

On the wrong side of each C square, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.


Place $B$ and $C$ squares right sides together. Stitch a scant $1 / 4$ " seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the square apart on the line to yield 2 HSTs, and press the seams to the darker triangles (B).


1 B square +1 C square $=2 \mathrm{~B} / \mathrm{CHSTs}$

On the wrong side of one HST, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.

Place both HSTs right sides together with the contrasting (B) triangles on opposite sides. Stitch a scant $1 / 4$ " seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the square apart on the line to yield 2 QSTs, and press the seams to one side (or open).

Repeat to make 8 B/C QSTs.
Trim QSTs to $2^{\prime \prime}$ ( $6^{\prime \prime}$ block) or $31 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ ( $12^{\prime \prime}$ block).

## Step 2

Align the diagonal cut edges of two E triangles with opposite sides of the $D$ square as shown.
Stitch a scant $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam along each edge, and press the seams to the triangles ( E ).
Repeat with the remaining E triangles on the remaining opposite sides of the $D$ square to make a square-in-a-square unit.

Trim unit to $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ( $6^{\prime \prime}$ block) or $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ( $12^{\prime \prime}$ block).


## Step 3

Lay out QST units, square-in-a-square unit, and 4 A squares as shown.
Join units to make the full block. Trim to $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ or $121^{\prime \prime \prime}$.
