The Starling block is just darling! It's been a while since I have made a star block, but I'm loving this block. Starling is a combination of a flower and star, I just had to squeeze a flower in somewhere. I love flowers! I added in something extra on the corners so when several blocks are sewn into a quilt, you would have a fun secondary design.
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## Cutting Instructions

| Qty | 6" finished block | 12" finished block |

| 4 | $21 / 4{ }^{\prime \prime}$ squares ( B ) | 4" squares (B) |
| 4 | 2" squares ( C ) | $311 / 2$ squares (C) |
| 8 | $11 / 2 \prime \times 2$ rectangles (D) | $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles (D) |
| 8 | $1112 \prime$ squares (E) | $2112 \prime$ squares ( E ) |
| 8 | 1" squares ( F ) | $11 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ squares ( F ) |
| 4 | $1{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles (G) | $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles (G) |

## Piecing Instructions

## Step 1

On the wrong side of each $B$ and $C$ square, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.


Place a B square in the top left corner of an A square, right sides together, as shown. Stitch on the line. Trim the seam to $1 / 41$, and press the seam to the B triangle.
Place a $C$ square in the bottom right corner of the same $A$ square, right sides together, as shown. Stitch on the line. Trim the seam to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, and press the seam to the B triangle
 to make an $A / B / C$ unit.

Repeat to make $4 \mathrm{~A} / \mathrm{B} / \mathrm{C}$ units. Trim all units to $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ( $6^{\prime \prime}$ block) or $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ( $12^{\prime \prime}$ block).

## Step 2



On the wrong side of each $E$ and $F$ square, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.

To make a LEFT D/E/F unit:
Repeat the stitch-and-flip method from Step 1, placing an E square at the bottom of a D rectangle and an F square in the top right corner of the same D rectangle to make a LEFT D/E/F unit.
Press seams towards the D rectangle.

> Tip: Pay careful attention to the direction of your seam line when placing your Esquares on the D rectangles for LEFT vs RIGHT units!

## To make a RIGHT D/E/F unit:

Repeat the stitch-and-flip method from Step 1, placing an E square at the bottom of a D rectangle and an F square in the top left corner of the same D rectangle to make a RIGHT D/E/F unit.
Press seams towards the E and F triangles.
Make 4 LEFT D/E/F units and 4 RIGHT D/E/F units.


Trim all units to $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}\left(6^{\prime \prime}\right.$ block) or $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}\left(12^{\prime \prime}\right.$ block).

## Get to know Heather...

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## Piecing Instructions, continued

## Step 3

Join a LEFT D/E/F unit and a RIGHT D/E/F unit together as shown. Sew a G rectangle to the top; press toward G.


Repeat to make 4 combined units.
Trim units to $21 / 2 \prime$ " ( $6^{\prime \prime}$ block) or $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}\left(12^{\prime \prime}\right.$ block).


## Step 4

Lay out the $A / B / C$ units, the $D / E / F$ units, and the $A$ square.
Join units as shown to make the full block. Trim to $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ or $12 \frac{1}{1 / 2}$.
