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## Indigo Light

I love the star theme of BH 5 because my quilting career began with patterns designed around stars. I like star patterns that are easy for the novice quilter to gain confidence before going on to set-in seams.
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## Cutting Instructions

| Qty | 6" finished block | 12" finished block |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| 4 | 2" squares (A) | 31121 squares (A) |
| 1 | $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square (B) | $71 / 2$ " square (B) |
| 4 | $25 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares (C) | $41 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares (C) |
| 2 | $21 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ squares, cut in half diagonally (D) | 4" squares, cut in half diagonally (D) |
| 2 | 2" squares, cut in half diagonally (E) | $31 / 2$ " squares, cut in half diagonally (E) |
| 2 | 2" squares, cut in half diagonally (F) | $311 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares, cut in half diagonally (F) |

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## Piecing Instructions

## Step 1

On the wrong side of each C square，draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown．
With right sides together，align 2 C squares in opposite corners of the $B$ square．
Stitch a scant $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam on both sides of the drawn line． Cut the square apart on the line to yield 2 partial flying geese units，and press the seams to the C triangles．



1 B square +4 C squares $=4 B / C$ flying geese Make 4.

With right sides together，align another $C$ square in the corner of the $B$ triangle．
Stitch a scant $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam on both sides of the drawn line．Cut the square apart on the line to yield 2 complete flying geese units，and press the seams to the $C$ triangles．


## Step 2

Place an E triangle and an F triangle right sides together as shown．Make sure you have aligned your triangles along the straight edge，not the longer bias edge created from cutting the $E$ and $F$ squares in half！

Join the triangles to make an E／F unit． Press seam to the darker print．

Repeat to make 4 E／F units．

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## Piecing Instructions, continued

## Step 3

Place an E/F unit and a D triangle right sides together as shown. Make sure you align the bottom straight edge of your E/F unit with the bias edge of your D triangle.

Note: Your E/F unit will be just a little larger than your D triangle.

Join to make a split QST.



Make 4.

Repeat to make 4 split QSTs. Trim QSTs to 2" (6" block) or $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ( $12^{\prime \prime}$ block).

## Step 4

Lay out 4 split QSTs as shown. Join to make a center unit measuring $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}\left(6^{\prime \prime}\right.$ block) or $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}\left(12^{\prime \prime}\right.$ block).


Join units to make the full block.
Trim to $61 / 2$ " or $121 / 22^{\prime \prime}$.
