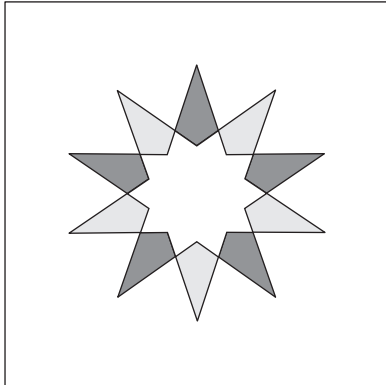




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Stellar Star

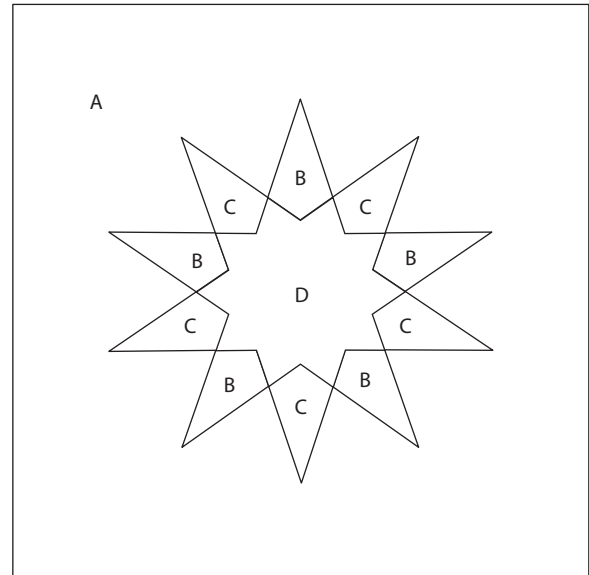

Cutting Instructions

Qty	6" finished block	12" finished block
1	7" square (A)	13" square (A)
5	3" x 7" rectangles (B)*	4" x 9" rectangles (B)*
5	3" x 7" rectangles (C)*	4" x 9" rectangles (C)*
1	6" square (B)**	11" square (B)**
1	6" square (C)**	11" square (C)**
1	4" square (D)	6" square (D)

**5-point star template option

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Piecing Instructions

Step 1

The star templates provided on pages 3-6 are for raw-edge appliqué. If you wish to use finished-edge appliqué, add a ¼" seam allowance to the outside edge of the star before cutting it from fabric.

Place the right side of the templates onto the wrong side of fabrics B, C, and D. Trace templates, cut out, and prepare according to your preferred method of appliqué.

Step 2

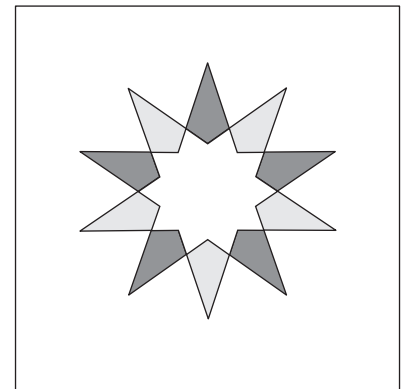
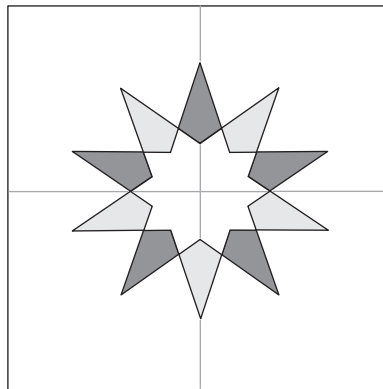
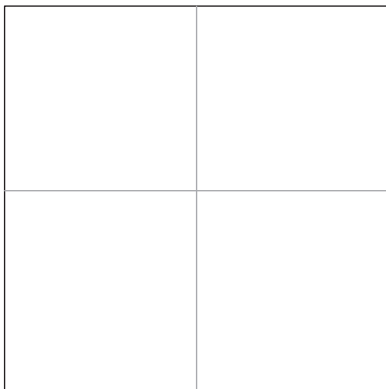
Fold the A background fabric square in half twice and finger press (gray lines indicate finger pressing).

With right side of A facing up, use the creases to assist you in centering the prepared appliqué pieces on your A square, right side facing up. Stitch in place.





Trim to 6 ½" or 12 ½" to complete.

Tip: Use any combination of the templates to create your star. For example, you could use one 5-point star, five individual star points, and the center 10-point star. Beginning appliquéers might find it easier to overlap the 5-point B star and 5-point C star rather than using the individual star points. If desired, trim away the center of the B and C stars after stitching them down to reduce bulk.

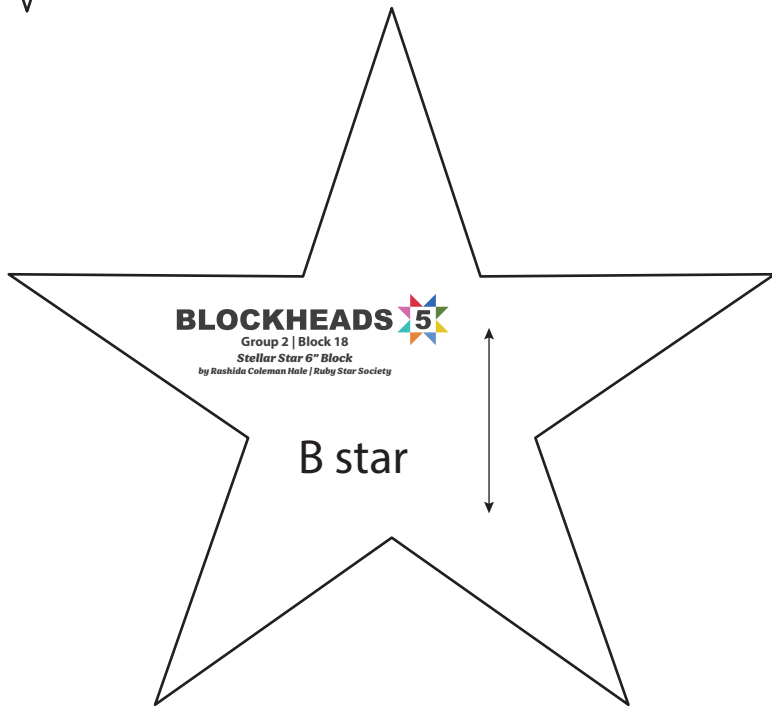
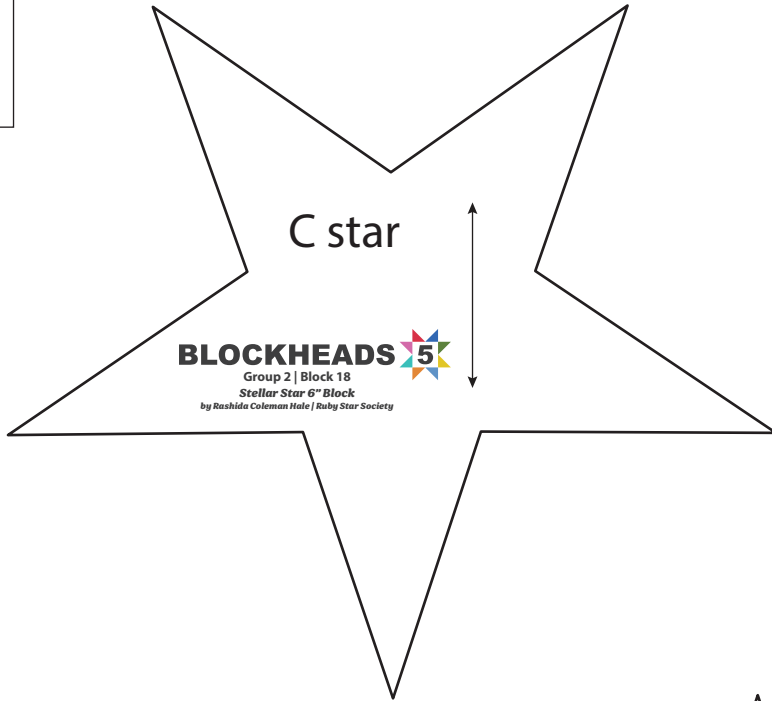

Get to know Rashida...

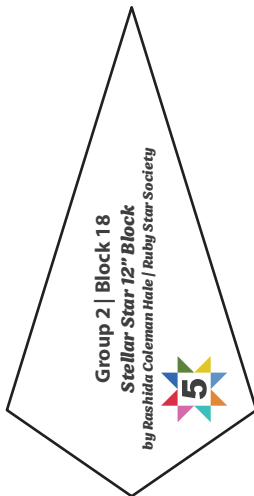
-  I know the stars have aligned when...

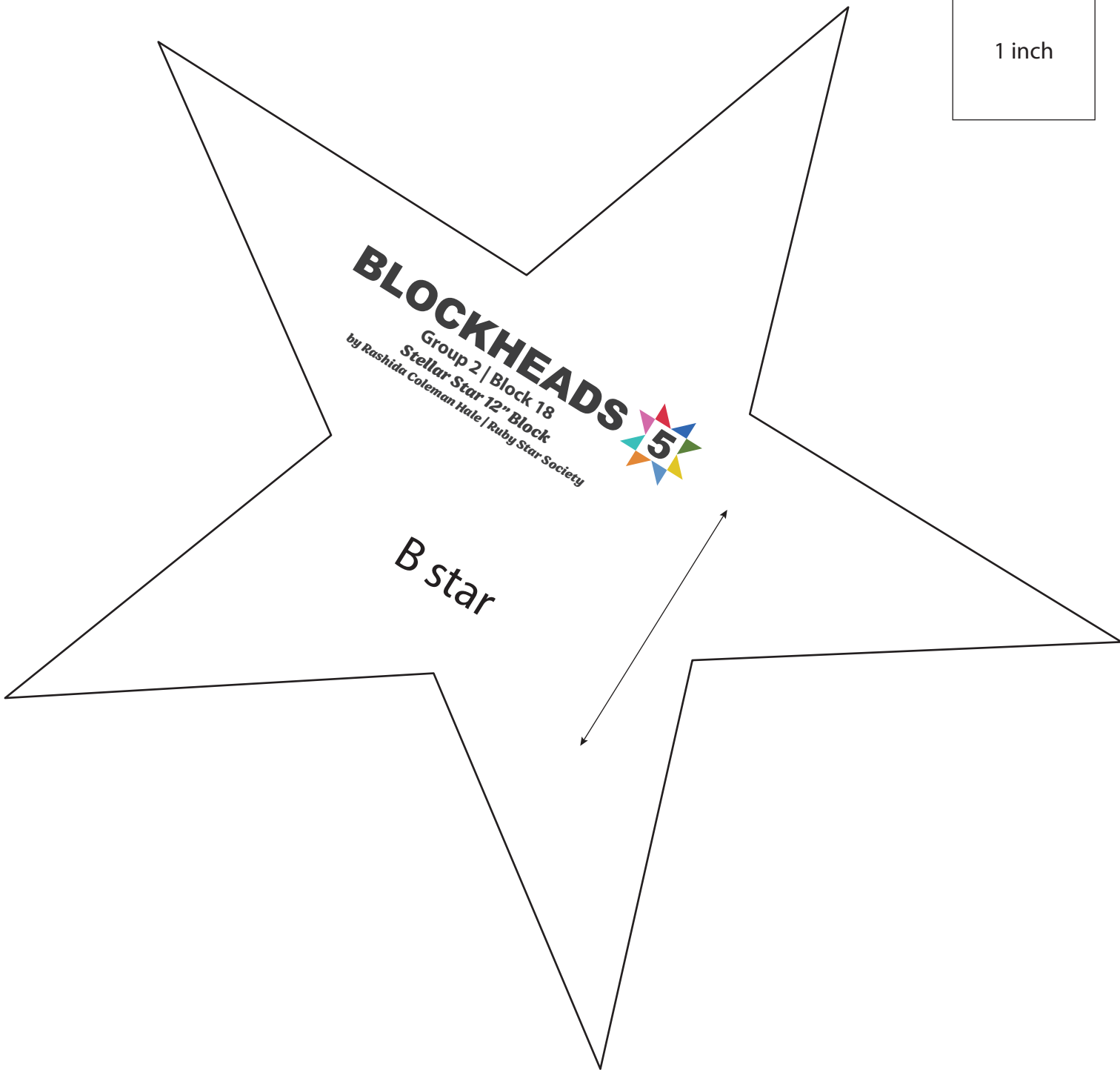
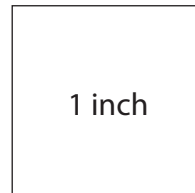
