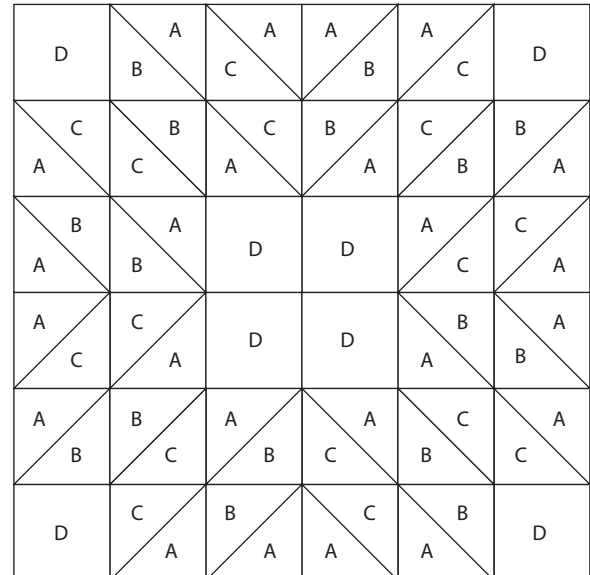

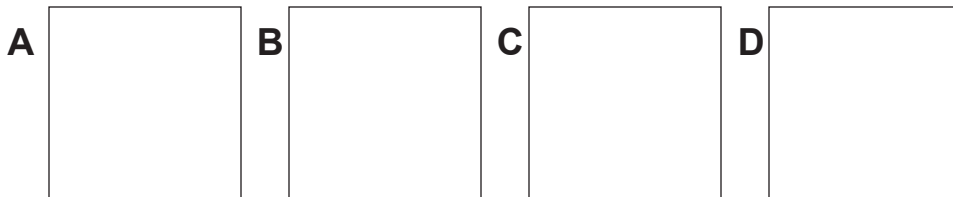
Cutting Instructions

Qty	6" finished block	12" finished block
12	2" squares (A)	3" squares (A)
8	2" squares (B)	3" squares (B)
8	2" squares (C)	3" squares (C)
8	1 ½" squares (D)	2 ½" squares (D)

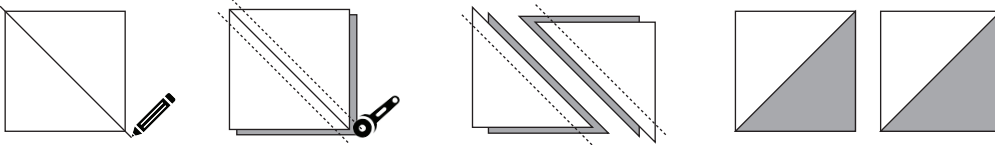
Piecing Instructions

Step 1

On the wrong side of each A square, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.

Place A and B squares right sides together. Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides of the drawn line.

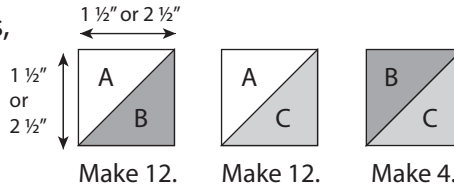
Cut the square apart on the line to yield 2 HSTs, and press the seams to the darker triangles (B).



1 A square + 1 B square = 2 A/B HSTs

Repeat to make 12 A/B HSTs, 12 A/C HSTs, and 4 B/C HSTs.

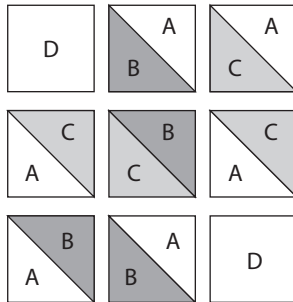
Trim all HSTs to $1\frac{1}{2}$ " (6" block) or $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (12" block).



Step 2

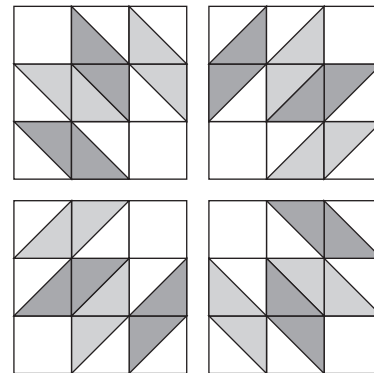
Lay out 3 A/B HSTs, 3 A/C HSTs, 1 B/C HST, and 2 D squares as shown.

Join to make a unit measuring $3\frac{1}{2}$ " (6" block) or $6\frac{1}{2}$ " (12" block). Repeat to make 4 units.



Step 3

Join units as shown to make the full block. Trim to $6\frac{1}{2}$ " or $12\frac{1}{2}$ ".
