

Beautifully Charming 70" x 70"

A charm pack quilt featuring fabrics from the Beautiful Day collection by Corey Yoder of Coriander Quilts for Moda Fabrics

Fabrics Needed:

1 Beautiful Day Charm pack 2 3/4 yards Dark Gray *or* Red fabric

(29134-24 gray) *or* (29134-31 red)

2 yards white background fabric (29134-11)

1 yard outer border fabric

(29132-22 gray) or (29131-11 red)

5/8 yard binding fabric

(29135-14 gray) *or* (29135-21 red)

4 1/2 yards backing fabric

(29131-14 gray) *or* (29132-31 red)

78" x 78" piece of batting

Cutting Instructions

wof = width of fabric

Choose (36) 5" charm pack squares (A)

From the gray/red fabric cut:

(6) strips 2 3/4" x wof; subcut (72) squares. 2 3/4" x 2 3/4" (B)

(12) strips 1 1/2" x wof; subcut (288) squares, 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" (C)

(8) strips 2 1/2" x wof; subcut (30) sashing rectangles, 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" (D)

(11) strips 2 1/2" x wof; trim selvages, sew strips end to end and subcut (7) strips, 2 1/2" x 58 1/2" (E)

(4) strips 2 1/2" x wof; trim selvages, sew strips end to end and subcut (2) strips, 2 1/2" x 62 1/2" (F)

From the background fabric cut:

(6) strips 2 3/4" x wof; subcut (72) squares, 2 3/4" x 2 3/4" (G)

(21) strips 2 1/4" x wof; subcut (288) rectangles, 2 1/4" x 2 3/4" (H)

From the outer border fabric cut:

(7) strips 4 1/2" x wof; trim selvages, sew end to end and cut:

(2) 4 1/2" x 62 1/2" side borders (I)


(2) 4 1/2" x 70 1/2" top/bottom borders (J)

From the binding fabric cut:

(8) strips 2 1/2" x wof; trim selvages, sew the strips together to form continuous binding

From the backing fabric cut:


(2) pieces 78" x wof; sew the pieces together to form the backing



Block Construction

RST=right sides together use a ¼" seam allowance read through all instructions before beginning

1. Draw a diagonal line across the back of one background **(G)** square. Place **(G)** RST with a print **(B)** square. Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn line. Cut apart on the drawn line to make 2 half square triangles (HST's). Press seams toward the print. Trim each HST to 2 1/4" x 2 1/4" square. Repeat to make a total of 4 HST's. (Illustration 1)



2. Draw a diagonal line across the back of a print **(C)** square. Place **(C)** RST, on the top/left corner of a background **(H)** rectangle. Orient the diagonal as illustrated. Sew on the marked line. Press away from the center. Make sure all raw edges align. Trim away the bottom two layers leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seams open. The left unit will measure 2 1/4" x 2 3/4". Repeat to make 4 left units units. (Illustration 2)





3. Follow the instructions in step 2 but place the **(C)** square on the top/right corner of **(H)** to create a right unit. Repeat to make 4 right units. (Illustration 3)




4. Sew together the left and right units to make Unit 1. Press seams to one side. Unit 1 will measure 2 1/4" x 5". Make 4. (Illustration 4)



5. Sew together the HST's, Unit 1's, and a print **(A)** square as illustrated to make one block. Press as illustrated. The completed block will measure $8\ 1/2$ " x $8\ 1/2$ ". Repeat steps 1-5 to make a total of 36 blocks.

Completing the Quilt Top

- 1. Lay out the blocks as illustrated. Place **(D)** sashing rectangles between each block. Sew together each row. Press toward **(D)**.
- 2. Sew the rows together placing (E) strips between each row. Press toward (E).
- 3. Sew **(E)** borders to the sides of the quilt. Press toward **(E)**. Sew **(F)** borders to the top/bottom of the quilt. Press toward **(F)**.
- 4. Sew (I) borders to the sides of the quilt. Press toward (I). Sew (J) borders to the top/bottom of the quilt. Press toward (J). The completed quilt top will measure 70 1/2" x 70 1/2".



Finishing the Quilt

Baste the quilt top, batting and backing fabric together using your preferred method. Quilt as desired and bind using the 2 1/2" prepared binding strips.
