Fabric Requirements

12 Fat Quarters*

**You will need the full 18" of width*

1/2 Yard Binding (9900 118)

2 Yards Backing

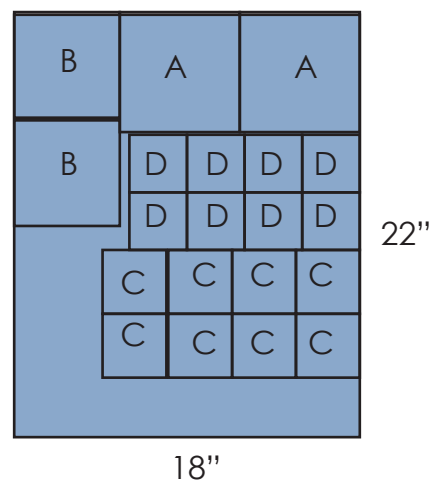

Cutting

From each fat quarter, cut the following. This will make (2) block backgrounds and (2) stars to mix and match.

- A** (2) 6 ¼" squares for flying geese centers
- B** (2) 5 ½" squares for star middles
- C** (8) 3 ⅜" squares for flying geese corners/star points
- D** (8) 3" squares for background corners

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Assembly

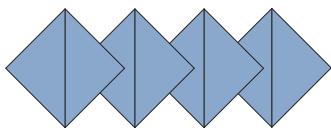
*Use a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press seams open unless otherwise noted.

BEFORE YOU SEW

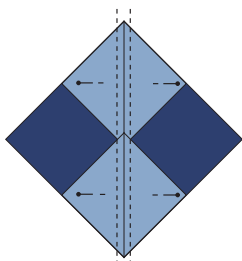
I recommend doing a rough layout of your 24 blocks before you start sewing your flying geese. Even if you shuffle things later, it's good to make sure your fabric pairs of stars & backgrounds are well distributed.

MAKE 4-AT-A-TIME FLYING GEESE

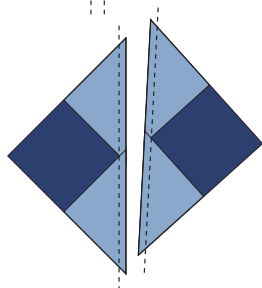
Using a fabric pen, mark a diagonal line on the **WRONG** SIDE of each $3\frac{3}{8}$ " square. These will become your star points.



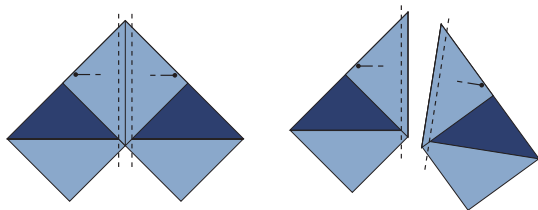
Pair (1) $6\frac{1}{4}$ " square with (4) $3\frac{3}{8}$ " squares--2 of these smaller will be set aside for the following step. Arrange right sides together as shown, and pin to secure.



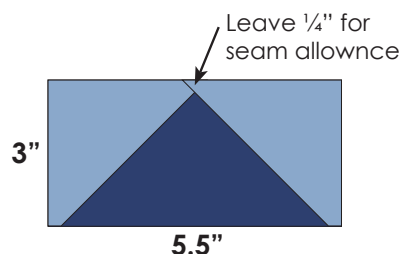
Sew a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " either side of the marked line. Cut unit in half along line, and press seams open.



Place remaining (2) $3\frac{3}{8}$ " squares RST on top of the units you just ironed, as shown. Pin to secure. Sew a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " either side of marked line. Cut in half along line, and press seams open.

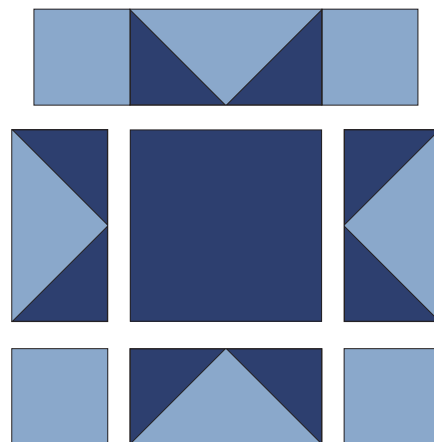


Trim geese to $5\frac{1}{2}$ "x3", making sure to leave $\frac{1}{4}$ " between top of the center goose and the top edge of the piece.



ASSEMBLE BLOCKS

Lay out (4) flying geese units along with (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " square star center and (4) 3" square background corners. You will make 24 blocks.



Join the pieces to make (3) rows, then join rows to complete the block. Finished block will measure 10"x10".

Join rows to complete quilt top, using image on front page as a diagram.

Then baste, quilt, bind, and sweet dreams!
