

The Navajo Quilt Project was started over five years ago by French General to bring awareness and supplies to Navajo quilters and help provide them with the essential quilting and sewing supplies they need for their livelihood. The Navajo Nation is the largest Indian reservation in the United States, comprising about 16 million acres, or about 25,000 square miles. Kaari has worked with master quilter, Susan Hudson to make sure senior centers are receiving supplies so that they can be distributed to remote areas throughout Arizona, New Mexico and Utah.

Susan explained the necessity of this project, "Some of us live hours away from a fabric store. Our reservation is so vast that the border towns can be over 100 miles away. The elders are on a fixed income and they can not afford to pay \$11 a yard or buy an expensive sewing machine. A lot of the elders do not have running water, internet, indoor plumbing, or electricity. They sew by hand or use a treadle sewing machine. Working with Kaari and The Navajo Quilt Project, the donations from people all over the country have made life a little easier for the elders."

As the Navajo Quilt Project continues, there is an opportunity to help improve the lives of Navajo quilters. We hope that this project will eventually provide an income to the grandmothers, mothers, and daughters who are able to make something that can then be used to sell or trade for supplies needed.

Donating your fabric and sewing supplies to the Navajo Quilt Project is easy. Simply pack up a box and send it to Susan through USPS. Be sure to include a self-addressed and stamped envelope for a confirmation.

A soft, pure natural linen that becomes incredibly soft and supple once washed. Use this linen for quilt backs, bed covers, and home textiles.




























FRENCH GENERAL WORKSHOPS
